WHEREAS; a proper regard for the dignity of all men is a fundamental precept in the United States of America; and

WHEREAS; in the practice of good will among all men in the United States, neighbors traditionally respect the rights of neighbors to hold their own religious beliefs, regardless of what they may be; and

WHEREAS; the Interfaith Movement is an organization dedicated to promoting belief in religious liberty, the dignity of the individual, and the highest ideals of human equality and fellowship; and

WHEREAS; Interfaith Day is celebrated nationally by resolution of the United States Senate to dramatize the great spiritual strength which our nation enjoys through the mutual respect of numerous religious faiths.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Oran K. Gragson, Mayor of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada do hereby proclaim Sunday, October 4, 1964 as

"INTERFAITH DAY" in the City of Las Vegas and urge all citizens to join in appropriate expressions of respect for and understanding of the many religious persuasions of our society, in order that we may live in close harmony and in a spirit of mutual good will and fellowship.
