

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the Nevada highway program is essential to the economic and social development of this State, and the results of its activity provide the means of moving people and material so vital to the State's continued growth and prosperity; and

WHEREAS, this year marks the fiftieth anniversary of the inauguration of the State Highway Department and State system of highways; and Nevada's phenomenal development in the past 50 years has paralleled the growth of its roadbuilding program; and

WHEREAS, planning, building and maintaining the system requires constant and detailed cooperation between State and local governments, and this cooperative effort results in improved means of meeting local road needs and developing better understanding at all governmental levels; and

WHEREAS, it is essential that the citizens of Nevada understand and appreciate the significance of the highway program to the economy and progress of the State, and the importance of participation by their elected officials in the planning construction of highway facilities:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Oran K. Gragson, Mayor of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, do hereby proclaim the week beginning September 24, 1967 as

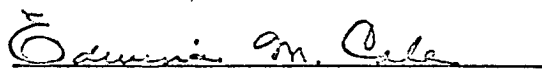
NATIONAL HIGHWAY WEEK
