

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the Las Vegas Post Office performs many vital services for the community; and

WHEREAS, each resident of Las Vegas has available to him the full resources of advancing technology to process ever increasing volumes of mail with speed and accuracy; and

WHEREAS, Postmaster Robert H. Lias and his employees are our friends and neighbors in addition to being dedicated public servants; and

WHEREAS, it is in the mutual interest of both individuals and business mailers to cooperate with the Postal Service in its public service programs designed to promote the general welfare and serve the common good; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Oran K. Gragson, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the City of Las Vegas, do hereby proclaim September 28, 1967, as
