WHEREAS, of the millions of Irishman now in the United States, many reside in Nevada and are treasured among our most highly respected citizens and best friends; and

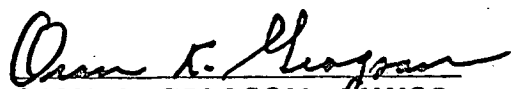
WHEREAS, it is fitting that we pay homage to this great Saint by annually setting aside a day in his name.
