WHEREAS, the police officers of the City of Las Vegas and law enforcement officers throughout the United States have worked devotedly and selflessly in behalf of the people of this City and of this Nation, regardless of the peril or hazard to themselves; and

WHEREAS, these officers have safeguarded the lives and property of the Citizens of this City and this Nation; and

WHEREAS, by the enforcement of our laws, these officers have given our City and our Nation internal freedom from fear of the violence of civil disorders; and

WHEREAS, these law enforcement officers by their patriotic service, loyalty and dedicated efforts have earned the gratitude of this City and of this Nation;

NOW THEREFORE, I, ORAN K' GRAGSON,

hereby proclaim May 15, 1970, to be:

PEACE OFFICERS MEMORIAL DAY
