WHEREAS, Woodrow Wilson has been a resident of the City of Las Vegas for 28 years; and

WHEREAS, in public life as a member of the Nevada Legislature and through his activities in government, and in private life as a civic leader of our community he has served the citizens in a distinguished and honorable manner; and

WHEREAS, organizations to which he has given dedicated service include the Kiwanis Club, the State Vocational Educational Advisory Committee, the Advisory Council of the Southwest Regional Laboratory for Educational Research and Development, the Las Vegas branch of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, the Clark County Republican Central and Executive Committees, the U. S. Civil Rights Commission, the Nevada Voters League, the Trustee Board of the Second Baptist Church, the Nevada Commission on Crime, the Clark County United Fund, the Clark County Economic Opportunity Board, and many others; and
