

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, Thanksgiving Day, November 23, 1972, will be observed throughout the nation as a festive occasion to commemorate the first religious holiday established in this nation and for the traditional giving of thanks for the many blessings enjoyed by the citizens of this nation; and

WHEREAS, the Thanksgiving holiday brings together members of families and relatives from far and near to share in this joyous occasion; and

WHEREAS, it is the custom of employers, public and private, to grant the day following Thanksgiving as an additional holiday, thus permitting a four-day holiday period when and where permitted by work loads and other factors; and

WHEREAS, all members of the Las Vegas Board of City Commissioners have concurred in extending for city employees the Thanksgiving Holiday through a four-day period and thus have declared Friday, November 24, 1972, to also be a holiday,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ORAN K. GRAGSON, Mayor of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, by virtue of the authority vested in me, do hereby declare the aforesaid additional holiday for all employees of this City.
