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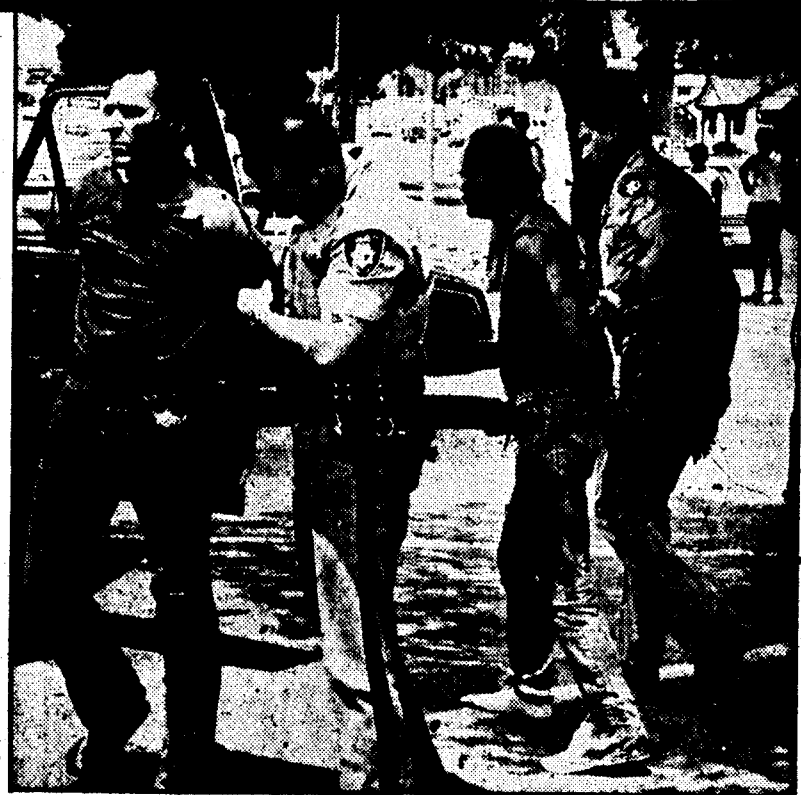

Eight arrested in arms, drug-making ring

A Metro Police patrol officer investigated a routine house burglary that led to the arrest Monday of not only three burglary suspects but also five other people and the recovery of three machine guns and cocaine valued at \$65,000, police said.

Theron Howard, a former Metro canine and narcotics officer now working out of the west substation, was cited by Sgt. Mark Habbeshaw for his effort in the nightlong investigation that re-

quired a residential stakeout and an undercover gun-selling operation.

Shortly after 1 a.m. Monday, Howard took a burglary report of the high-powered weapons stolen from the home of a gun collector who lives near Washington Avenue and Jones Boulevard, and developed leads on the suspects from the victim.

After the arrest of three suspects, one a former associate of the victim whose identity was not made available, Howard learned of the burglars' alleged "middle-

man" who would find buyers for the weapons, Habbeshaw said, calling the guns "awesome firepower."

Patrol officers, detectives and undercover agents then joined in the investigation that led to Monday afternoon's arrest of three people in the department store parking lot at Charleston Boulevard off of Boulder Highway and the arrest of two others at 2805 Burnham Ave.

Arrested at an iron works shop on Pink Street and charged with burglary, conspiracy to commit burglary and possession of stolen property were Jane Sue Harris, 32, of 4136 Silver Dollar Ave.; Ronald Derek Vereen, 32, of 4414 Del Oro Drive, and Mark Burkhart, 29, of 4136 Silver Dollar.

Arrested in the department store parking lot and charged with conspiracy to commit robbery with a deadly weapon and conspiracy to possess stolen property were Paul Henry Graham, 31, of 1301 Harriet St.; Wesley James Naylor, 39, of no fixed address, and Kathy Mary Burns, 32, of 1512 Vegas Drive.

Arrested at the Burnham address and charged with conspiracy to commit robbery and conspiracy to possess stolen property were Timothy Arnett Weldon, 29, and his wife Betty Weldon, 27, five-year residents of the house.

Police also charged those arrested with racketeering.

Recovered were three machine guns, a semi-automatic rifle and ammunition valued at \$7,000 from the iron shop, a sawed-off shot gun and a pistol from the suspects in the parking lot and about 200 grams of cocaine with a street value of between \$80,000 and \$95,000, police said.

To kick off the undercover gun-selling operation, a Metro undercover officer was introduced to the alleged middlemen by one of the accused burglars, Habbeshaw said.

But the undercover operation was started several weeks after

were being set up by the gun buyers to be robbed of the stolen weapons, Habbeshaw said, adding the suspects had agreed to pay \$3,500 for the guns.

The alleged gun buyers arrived at the department store parking lot at the agreed time, left without going through with the deal with the undercover officers and returned around noon to be arrested by waiting patrol officers armed with shotguns.

Police didn't find \$3,500 when they searched the suspects. Police, however, found clothing packed away in their truck, indicating the suspects would be leaving Las Vegas soon.

A police officer at the department store parking lot discovered what appeared to be a small plastic bag filled with cocaine when he opened a gold pocket watch taken off a suspect. More cocaine was discovered during further investigation.
