GENERAL NOTES

1. EXACT LOCATION OF ALL SAW-CUT LINES SHALL BE DETERMINED IN THE FIELD BY A CLARK COUNTY INSPECTOR.
2. HANDICAP RAMPS SHALL BE CONSTRUCTED IN EACH QUADRANT OF AN INTERSECTION PER STANDARD DRAWING NO 235, CLARK COUNTY STANDARDS. EXACT LOCATION OF THE RAMPS SHALL BE DETERMINED IN THE FIELD BY A CLARK COUNTY INSPECTOR.
3. CURB AND GUTTER WITH A GRADE OF LESS THAN 4/10 OF ONE PERCENT SHALL BE CONSTRUCTED BY FORMING. EACH JOINT SHALL BE CHECKED FOR GRADE PRIOR TO CONSTRUCTION AND WATER TESTED AS SOON AS POSSIBLE AFTER CONSTRUCTION.
4. ALL OFF-SITE IMPROVEMENT CONSTRUCTION SHALL CONFORM TO THE UNIFORM STANDARD SPECIFICATIONS AND IMPROVEMENT DRAWINGS, LATEST REVISION. NO DEVIATIONS SHALL BE ALLOWED.
5. FINAL ASPHALTIC CONCRETE (AC) PAVEMENT SURFACES SHALL BE ONE-HALF INCH ABOVE THE TIP OF THE GUTTER (INCLUDING OPEN GRADE).
6. PRIVATE STREETS AND/OR DRIVEWAYS REFLECTED ON THESE PLANS ARE TO BE INSPECTED BY A CLARK COUNTY INSPECTOR.

LAS VEGAS VALLEY WATER DISTRICT NOTES

1. ALL WORK TO CONFORM TO THE LAS VEGAS VALLEY WATER DISTRICT LATEST STANDARD DRAWINGS AND SPECIFICATIONS.
2. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL FOLLOW THE GUIDELINES AND REGULATIONS AS SET FORTH IN OSHA. THE ENGINEER AND/OR OWNER SHALL NOT BE RESPONSIBLE FOR JOB SITE SAFETY PROCEDURES.
3. PROTECTION AND REPLACEMENT OF SURVEY MONUMENTS OR PROPERTY STAKES NOT DELINEATED ON THE CONTRACT DOCUMENTS SHALL BE THE CONTRACTOR'S RESPONSIBILITY.
4. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL PROVIDE ALL NECESSARY HORIZONTAL AND VERTICAL TRANSITIONS BETWEEN NEW CONSTRUCTION AND EXISTING SURFACES TO PROVIDE FOR PROPER DRAINAGE AND OF INGRESS AND EGRESS TO SAID CONSTRUCTION. EXTENT OF TRANSITIONS TO BE DETERMINED IN THE FIELD BY THE LVWD ENGINEER.
5. ALL WORK, EXCEPT AS MODIFIED BY THESE PLANS OR BY NOTE 10, SHALL BE ACCOMPLISHED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE MOST CURRENT EDITION OF THE UNIFORM STANDARD SPECIFICATIONS FOR PUBLIC WORKS CONSTRUCTION OFFSITE IMPROVEMENT, CLARK COUNTY AREA.
6. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL TAKE ALL PRECAUTIONARY MEASURES NECESSARY TO PROTECT THE DISTRICT'S AND ALL OTHER'S EXISTING IMPROVEMENTS, WHICH ARE TO REMAIN IN PLACE, FROM DAMAGE AND ALL SUCH IMPROVEMENTS OR STRUCTURES DAMAGED BY THE CONTRACTOR'S OPERATIONS SHALL BE REPAIRED OR RECONSTRUCTED SATISFACTORY TO THE OWNER OF THE EXISTING IMPROVEMENT AT THE EXPENSE OF THE CONTRACTOR.

ALL CONSTRUCTION AND MATERIALS SHALL BE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE "UNIFORM STANDARD SPECIFICATIONS FOR PUBLIC WORKS CONSTRUCTION OFF-SITE IMPROVEMENTS, CLARK COUNTY AREA NEVADA", LATEST ISSUE; THE "UNIFORM STANDARD DRAWINGS FOR PUBLIC WORKS CONSTRUCTION, CLARK COUNTY AREA NEVADA", LATEST ISSUE; AND OTHER APPLICABLE APPROVED STANDARDS ISSUED BY THE CONTROLLING AGENCY; THE UNIFORM BUILDING CODE; AND ALL LOCAL CITY CODES AND ORDINANCES APPLICABLE, EXCEPT AS NOTED ON THIS SHEET AS "DEVIATIONS FROM STANDARDS".

5. CONTRACTOR SHALL PROVIDE ALL NECESSARY HORIZONTAL AND VERTICAL TRANSITIONS BETWEEN NEW CONSTRUCTION AND EXISTING SURFACES TO PROVIDE FOR PROPER DRAINAGE AND FOR INGRESS AND EGRESS TO NEW CONSTRUCTION. THE EXTENT OF TRANSITIONS TO BE AS SHOWN ON PLANS, OR AS DESIGNATED IN THE FIELD BY A CITY INSPECTOR.
6. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL TAKE ALL PRECAUTIONS NECESSARY TO PROTECT EXISTING PERMANENT SURVEY MONUMENTS. ANY MONUMENTS DISTURBED SHALL BE REPLACED AND ADJUSTED PER AVAILABLE RECORDS IN ACCORDANCE WITH N.R.S. STATUTE NO. 625.550.
7. UTILITY COMPANY METER BOXES, MANHOLE LIDS, VALVE COVERS, ETC. SHALL BE LOCATED OUT OF DRIVEWAY APRONS, FLOWLINES, AND CROSS GUTTERS UNLESS WRITTEN APPROVAL IS GRANTED BY THE UTILITY COMPANY AND THE CITY ENGINEER.
8. THE LAS VEGAS VALLEY WATER DISTRICT IS SOLELY RESPONSIBLE FOR TESTING AND INSPECTIONS TO ENSURE THAT ALL WORK PERFORMED COMPLIES WITH APPLICABLE STANDARDS AND SPECIFICATIONS.
9. COORDINATE ALL WORK WITH 3205 ZONE INLET/OUTLET PIPELINE ROUGH GRADING ALONG ALTA DRIVE.

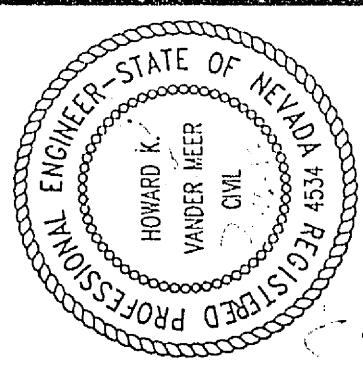
