

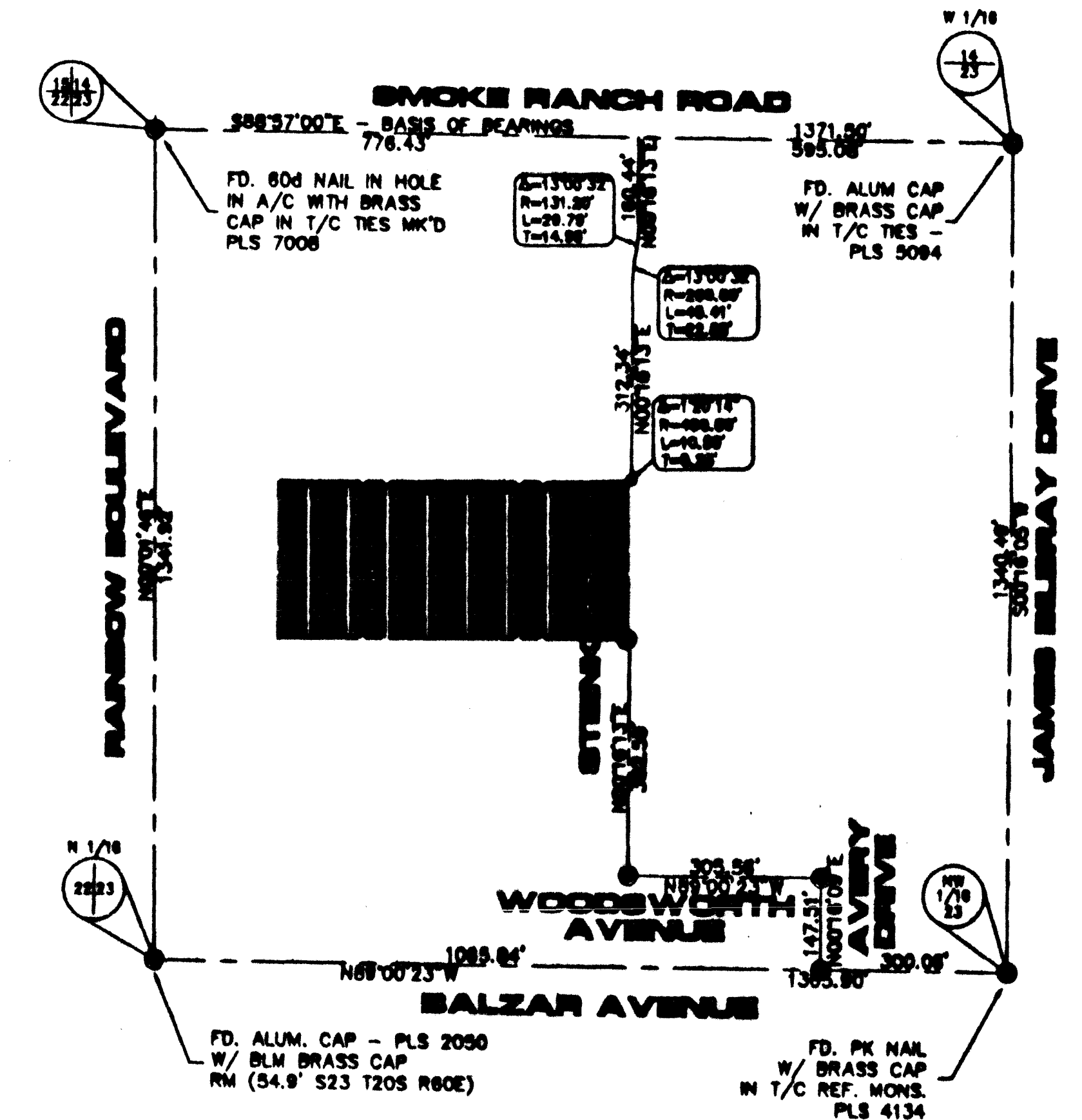
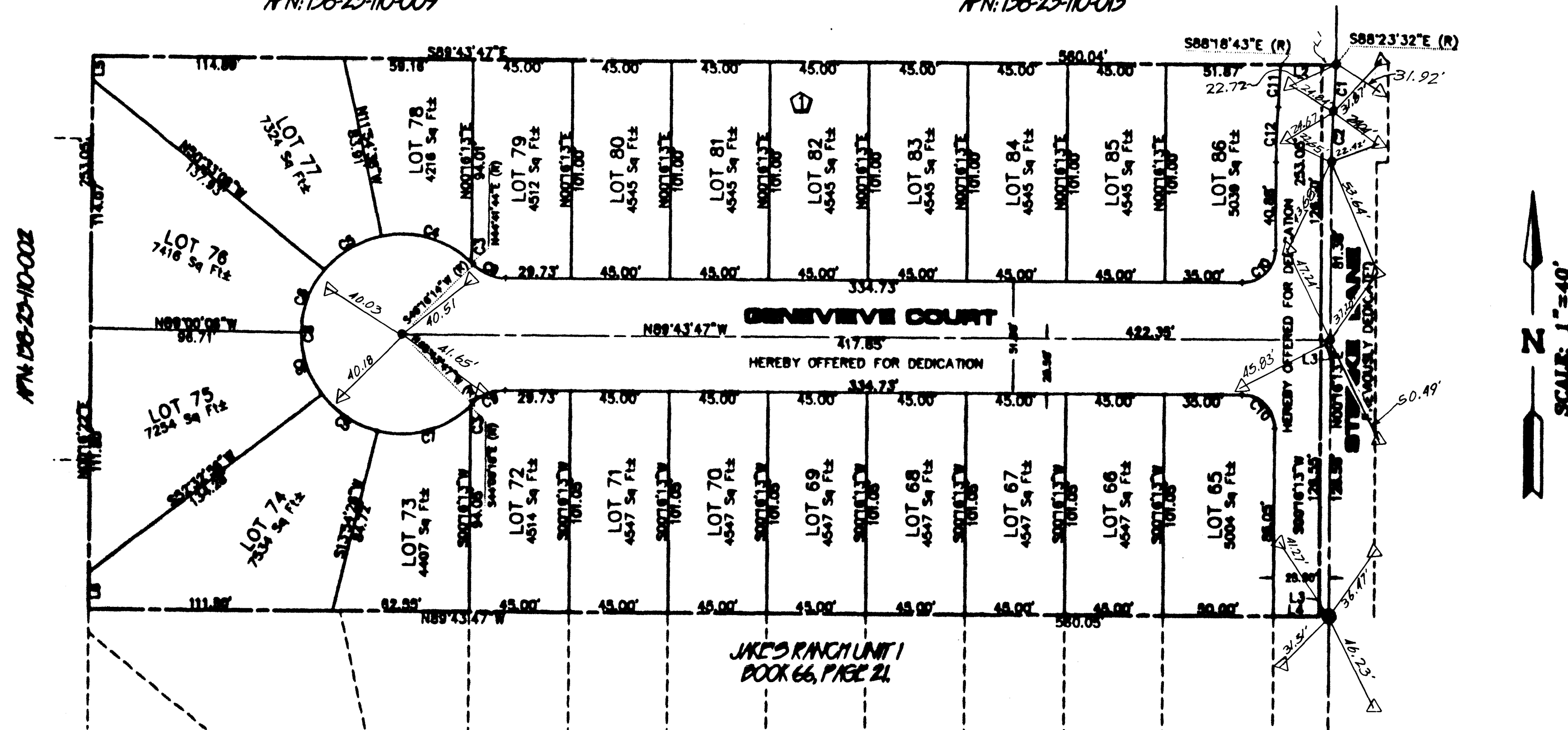
MONUMENTATION MAP OF JAKE'S RANCH UNIT 3

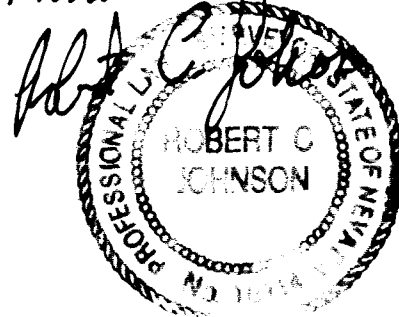

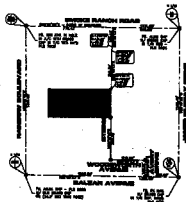
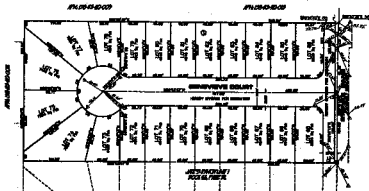
