

RESOLUTION NO. R-21-2017

**A RESOLUTION CONCERNING A PROPOSED SPECIAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT
AND APPROVING THE FORM OF AN IMPROVEMENTS REIMBURSEMENT
AGREEMENT**

WHEREAS, the City Council (the "Council") of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada (the "City"), has received a request from The Howard Hughes Company, LLC (the "Developer") to consider conducting, in the future, proceedings pursuant to the provisions of Nevada Revised Statutes Chapter 271 to form a special improvement district within the City (the "District"), to levy special assessments, and to issue one or more series of bonds (the "Bonds") to provide for the construction, acquisition, or furnishing of certain public improvements within the District, and

WHEREAS, the Developer has previously constructed certain roadway improvements (the "Roadway Improvements") and water lines (the "Water Lines") which will benefit the properties anticipated to be in the District, and

WHEREAS, the Developer has requested that, if the District is formed, the City levy special assessments against the properties in the District to finance a portion of the cost of the Roadway Improvements and Water Lines as well as other public improvements, and

WHEREAS, the Developer desires to dedicate the Roadway Improvements to the City and the Water Lines to the Las Vegas Valley Water District prior to formation of the District and execution of a Development and Financing Agreement between the City and the Developer relating to the District, and

WHEREAS, the Developer has requested that the City reimburse the Developer for a portion of the costs of the Roadway Improvements and Water Lines from proceeds of the Bonds, and

WHEREAS, the City desires to facilitate such reimbursement, subject to the conditions contained in the Improvements Reimbursement Agreement by and between the Developer and the City (the "Agreement"), the form of which has been presented to the Council

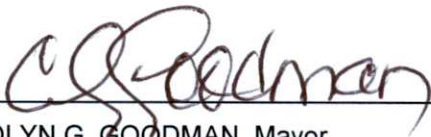
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAS VEGAS, IN THE STATE OF NEVADA

Section 1. The form, terms and provisions of the Agreement are approved, and the City shall enter into and perform its obligations under the Agreement in substantially the form of such document presented to the Council at this meeting, with only such changes therein as are required by the circumstances and are not inconsistent herewith; and the officers of the City are hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver such document as required hereby.

Section 2. All resolutions, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this resolution, are hereby repealed to the extent only of such inconsistency. This repealer shall not be construed to revive any resolution, or part thereof, previously repealed.


Section 3. If any section, paragraph, clause or other provision of this resolution shall for any reason be held to be invalid or unenforceable, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph, clause or other provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this resolution.

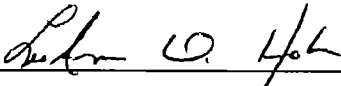
