Minutes:

The appellant was present.

SERGEANT REAGAN ALEXANDER, Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department (Metro), indicated that the submitted confidential report contains a history of MS. GILLOON'S background. MAYOR GOODMAN confirmed with SERGEANT ALEXANDER that the report indicates that the potential employer is willing to hire MS. GILLOON despite her past issues. As MS. GILLOON did not have a letter from her employer, the Mayor then verified with MS. GILLOON that she made her employer aware of all the information contained in the report and is willing to hire her.

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COUNCILMAN ROSS commented that he could not support issuing MS. GILLOON a work card, even though the employer is willing to hire her despite her criminal history. He is compelled to protect the community.

COUNCILMAN WOLFSON wondered how the Council can be certain potential employers are made aware of the full criminal history of an appellant. MAYOR GOODMAN indicated that appellants have been advised to obtain a report from Metro to submit to the employer and to attach a signed copy to the letter of appeal. COUNCILMAN WOLFSON remarked that he is familiar with this processes, but he would prefer to continue discussion on this issue to ensure that something is not missed in the process. SERGEANT ALEXANDER added that the letter from the employer should list the reasons for denial by Metro. COUNCILMAN WOLFSON did not feel that the applicant should be required to list the reasons. A pre-prepared form should be given to the appellant to provide to the employer. SERGEANT ALEXANDER remarked that the only issue with that would be dissemination by Metro or the City of an appellant's criminal history; therefore, it has to be the appellant.

MAYOR GOODMAN advised MS. GILLOON that her work card is site specific, and she will have to appear before the Council within six months for a review.
