Minutes:

FRANK TRUPIANO, Department of Public Works, stated the redevelopment of the historic Fifth Street School is in its final phase and requested approval of the reactivation of a 62-square foot fountain located in the main courtyard. He stated that the fountain's location is on the east side of the gymnasium in the center courtyard. The existing mosaic tile is not original and the original tile of 1936 will be restored. Over 3,100 square feet of existing turf would be converted and MR. TRUPIANO displayed pictures of the completed fountain. MR. TRUPIANO informed MAYOR GOODMAN that completion would be January 2008.

MAYOR GOODMAN expressed that he would share this matter at a meeting with the state engineer regarding water issues as this is a fine example of COUNCILMAN BROWN'S order to exchange turf in order to allow these features. This matter proves the City is doing their part to allow such amenities during the drought.

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MAYOR GOODMAN noted construction taking place on Fourth Street and STEVE VANGORP, Redevelopment Manager, verified it is the beginning phase of the Liberty Bell project and stated there is a two-month cycle for completion.

COUNCILMAN REESE reiterated the conditions and supported the request.
