**PURPOSE/BACKGROUND:**

In 2003 the City Council adopted Resolution R-26-2003, which established a committee to make recommendations to the Council regarding the filling of judicial vacancies on the Municipal Court. This committee, although established, has not had occasion to perform its functions. It has been suggested that the process of reviewing applications for judicial vacancies that might occur can and should be undertaken by the Council and that the committee is not needed at the present time. This Resolution will accomplish that by repealing Resolution R-26-2003.
