**PURPOSE/BACKGROUND:**

T-Mobile will replace an existing ball field standard with a monopole slimline array with relocated ball field lights from an existing light standard to support the wireless communication system, equipment shelter and security fencing. T-Mobile shall pay the City a one-time, administrative fee of \$1,000 and the yearly rent will start at \$15,000. The initial term is for five years with three five-year options.
