**Minutes:**

The appellant was present.

TONI WEEKS, Detective, Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department (Metro), indicated the convictions for crimes of moral turpitude in July 2006 which resulted in the denial of a workcard. The position the appellant is seeking would provide access to credit card information.

MS. WALLACE responded to the Detective's report that she would never repeat her crimes. COUNCILMAN WOLFSON confirmed with DETECTIVE WEEKS she was not present when MS. WALLACE allegedly fully disclosed her criminal history. He questioned what safeguards exist. DETECTIVE WEEKS affirmed that her investigation includes asking the employer to

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outline what the appellant reported. In this case, MS. WALLACE made full disclosure. COUNCILMAN WOLFSON suggested policy and legal changes to allow Metro to disclose to employers in order to facilitate the overall process.

MAYOR GOODMAN pointed out that people need to be able to work. COUNCILWOMAN TARKANIAN expressed her dismay at the employer's failure to protect his patrons. She could not support MS. WALLACE in this position because of her past record and her access to patrons' personal information. MS. WALLACE can work some where else or in another position at this restaurant, at least for a period of time. COUNCILMAN REESE concurred with the Councilwoman.
