Minutes:

MAYOR GOODMAN declared the Public Hearing open.

JOE BAHNAN, owner of the subject, was present.

DON WALFORD, property owner of a business located at 3001 East Charleston Boulevard, has been at this location for 23 years and has seen a vast improvement in this area through redevelopment. This use will be a detriment to adjacent properties and there are other facilities that already sell liquor. He asked if this will be a liquor store that sells mostly liquor with a small amount of goods. MARGO WHEELER, Director of Planning and Development

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Department, explained that for this type of application, the sale of alcohol beverages is limited to a maximum of 10 percent of the store's floor area. MR. WALFORD reiterated that several other business owners feel this is not appropriate for the area.

COUNCILMAN REESE noted that this location housed Weber's Second Day bread store. There is alcohol in the area and this area does not need to be saturated with alcohol. This type of use is not compatible or harmonious for the area.

MAYOR GOODMAN declared the Public Hearing closed.
