Minutes:

CHRIS KNIGHT, Director of Administrative Services, indicated that the legislative session ended the afternoon of 6/5/2007, and a special session started. He then referred to the detailed Legislative Report, a copy of which was submitted, to update the Council on the bills of interest to the City, as well as on some of the last-minute new bills that were submitted.

Regarding AB 514, COUNCILMAN WOLFSON requested that MR. KNIGHT elaborate on the hearing master for traffic matters. MR. KNIGHT clarified that the traffic commissioner/master for traffic court was approved, takes effect July 1, 2007, and can be appointed by the City Council after the position is created and funded in the budget. The master/executive judge

designation can be done by election amongst the Municipal Court judges and becomes effective June 4, 2007. DEPUTY CITY MANAGER FRETWELL rejoined that, based on projected revenues, the earliest that the approved positions in AB 514 could be implemented is January 2008.

MAYOR GOODMAN commented on the outcome of this legislative session. The success of the Arena District bill would have put the City on very dangerous ground. With its failure, the City will be moving forward with an arena committee to review the seven proposals that were received, which will dictate much of the future development in the downtown area. He is very satisfied with the outcome of AB 604/SB 149, because it is good for the citizens of the City of Las Vegas; however, he opined that the voter turnout for the municipal elections is shameful. The funding cutback for the Nuvo Brain Institute is very disappointing, as well as for the jewelry mart, for which he asked staff to look into possibly assisting the developer with making up the difference in anticipated loss.
