**PURPOSE/BACKGROUND:**

The City of Las Vegas sold to the Las Vegas Police Protective Association Metro, Inc. (PPA) the real property at the Northwestern corner of 7th Street and Stewart Avenue (PPA Site) for development of an office building for the PPA. Because the City of Las Vegas Redevelopment Agency desires to obtain the PPA Site for the future development of a professional sports arena, the Agency has offered to exchange its property at the Southeastern corner of 4th Street & Clark Avenue (RDA Site) for the PPA Site. The difference in values between the RDA Site and the PPA Site will compensate the PPA for its time and money invested in developing the PPA Site.
