PURPOSE/BACKGROUND:

Section 9.36.050 of the Municipal Code imposes certain information-gathering and reporting requirements on the Department of Fire and Rescue regarding the transportation of hazardous materials within the City. It has been determined that these requirements are out-of-date, and they are proposed to be eliminated by means of this bill.

RECOMMENDATION:

The 3/6/2007 Recommending Committee held this bill in abeyance to the 3/20/2007 Recommending Committee for review, hearing and recommendation to the City Council for final action.

CHIEF DEPUTY CITY ATTORNEY STEED reported that this bill was held in abeyance at the last Recommending Committee meeting because the Committee members expressed concern about eliminating the reporting requirements. After reviewing some options, staff is recommending a First Amendment, a copy of which he submitted, to require bi-annual reports to the Management Committee for Emergency Operations instead of eliminating the requirements altogether. COUNCILMAN ROSS stated that the Proposed First Amendment addresses his concerns.
