BEATRICE TURNER, West Las Vegas, commended MEMBER WILLIAMS for holding the grocery store matter of the 4/18/2007 Council meeting. She also commended City staff, noting that City staff performs much better than County staff.

TED RUSSELL, Las Vegas resident, said he is the happiest citizen in the universe, with all the redevelopment and progress in the downtown area.

RICKY HOOPER, 831 South Third Street, complained about the substandard sidewalks along Fremont Street, Las Vegas Boulevard to Maryland Parkway. He is sometimes forced to travel on the street. He urged the City to make repairs. MEMBER GOODMAN asked him to contact CHARLIE KAJKOWSKI, Director of Public Works.

The City does not come through on its promises. He also complained about the police department being out of control. CHAIRMAN GOODMAN said he would provide MR. JOHNSTONE with the email where he refused assistance.
