Minutes:

SUSAN McMASTERS, Ward 4 resident, submitted a petition and various documents concerning ongoing issues with the small dog park. She thanked Council for addressing some of the issues; however, there are still some that have not been addressed on the large dog park, dealing with over watering and inoperable sprinklers. She showed pictures and a video depicting the issues and requested to speak on behalf of each person represented on the petition. MAYOR GOODMAN clarified that was incorrect, and everyone in attendance has to have an opportunity to speak within the allotted time given. MAYOR GOODMAN stressed venues that the public can speak with the Mayor and to each Councilperson.

TOM McGOWAN stressed that citizens are not the government's public; the Council is the public's government. He then read a document pertaining to "18b". He felt it was important for Council to stay focused on what their duties and boundaries are, as there are enough elected officials on their way to prison.

DOROTHY BARNES reiterated her ongoing problems at Nellis Air Force Base and those that continue to lie on her and use her name.

TED RUSSELL, Ward 5 resident, expressed his excitement for the proposed REI development. He also appreciated COUNCILMAN WOLFSON'S humility and suggested changing the name of Lady Luck to Hard Luck. He will follow up with Council regarding the Neonopolis.

EILEEN McKYTON, Spring Mountain Ranch resident, expressed concern for the verbiage on Item 81. She believed the verbiage was conflicting between what the City Attorney told her, COUNCILMAN ROSS' website and MARGO WHEELER. The wording should be specific as to what is being changed, and if the item was approved, she questioned its legality.

ANTHONY HODGES believed the Council was in violation of the Open Meeting Law, as it is not indicated on the Council's agenda concerning speakers' information given prior to making comments. He was also strongly displeased at the NAACP who has been in violation for over 10
