COUNCILMAN BARLOW requested the item be trailed to the afternoon portion of the agenda so that MARGO WHEELER, Director of Planning and Development Department, could make a presentation.

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MS. WHEELER explained the update would bring the maps within the plan up-to-date with changes that previously have been approved by the City Council, subsequent to the project's original approval. In addition, requirements are being changed to reflect Title 19 revisions that have occurred since the draft was written, as well as minor modifications, such as revisions to sidewalk design and wall and fence requirements based on projects that have been submitted subsequent to the plan's original adoption. This implementation will be easier for the City and those developing within the area.
