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Minutes:

SCOTT ADAMS, Operations Officer for the Redevelopment Agency, explained that Redevelopment Agency Items 3 and 4 are related to City Council Item 68, and their approval is contingent upon approval of City Council Item 68. The three items involve a CVIP agreement regarding some improvements that were already made before making application for the CVIP and future improvements. Most of the recommended \$50,000 CVIP grant would be for new improvements to be made, with some retroactive credit to be given. Before and after pictures were shown of the front and rear of the building. He recommended approval.
