Minutes:

JIM DiFIORE, Manager of Business Services, reported that the applicant, who was present, was seeking to open for an eight-hour period at the location of 2025 East Charleston Boulevard, in order to preserve the alcohol rights, with the intention of relocating the license to a new location at 2100 East Fremont Street. Therefore, the temporary approval, if granted, would be for an eight-hour period. The applicant would then return before the Council for consideration of the license

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for the new location. Planning and Development Department staff has advised MR. LAINO that no additional special use permit would be required. He suggested approval of the temporary license for a one-day period.

COUNCILMAN REESE indicated that he did not view the locations as the same parcel, because they have access from different streets. He noted that he was not opposed to the applicant trying to preserve the license; however, he did have concerns about the operations at 2100 East Fremont Street. MR. DiFIORE advised COUNCILMAN REESE that the license for that address would come back before the Council at a later date.
