RE: SDR-13880 – SITE DEVELOPMENT PLAN REVIEW  
CITY COUNCIL MEETING OF SEPTEMBER 6, 2006  
RELATED TO VAR-13881, VAR-14355, SUP-13882 AND SUP-13884

Dear Applicant:

The City Council at a regular meeting held September 6, 2006 APPROVED the request for a Site Development Plan Review FOR A PROPOSED 30,904 SQUARE FOOT RETAIL CENTER AND A WAIVER OF THE PERIMETER LANDSCAPE REQUIREMENTS on 2.07 acres on the east side of Eastern Avenue, approximately 153 feet north of Mesquite Avenue (APN 139-36-110-002 and 003), C-1 (Limited Commercial) Zone and R-E (Residence Estates) Zone under Resolution of Intent to C-1 (Limited Commercial). The Notice of Final Action was filed with the Las Vegas City Clerk on September 7, 2006. This approval is subject to:

Planning and Development

1. There shall be no vehicular access to the south.
2. The perimeter wall shall be six feet solid block except the southwestern 50 feet which may be four foot solid with two feet top wrought iron.
3. Approval of and conformance to the Conditions of Approval for Variance (VAR-13881), Variance (VAR-14355), and Special Use Permits (SUP-13884, SUP-13877, and SUP-13880) shall be required.
4. This approval shall be void two years from the date of final approval, unless a building permit has been issued for the principal building on the site. An Extension of Time may be filed for consideration by the City of Las Vegas.
5. All development shall be in conformance with the site plan, landscape plan, date stamped 06/30/06, and building elevations, date stamped 05/30/06, except as amended by conditions herein.
6. A technical landscape plan, signed and sealed by a Registered Architect, Landscape Architect, Residential Designer or Civil Engineer, must be submitted prior to or at the same time application is made for a building permit. A permanent underground sprinkler system is required, and shall be

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permanently maintained in a satisfactory manner; the landscape plan shall include irrigation specifications. The technical landscape plan shall show trees and shrubs along the perimeter, around the buildings, and in the parking lot.

7. Pre-planting and post-planting landscape inspections are required to ensure the appropriate plant material, location, size of planters, and landscape plans are being utilized. The Planning and Development Department must be contacted to schedule an inspection prior to the start of the landscape installation and after the landscape installation is completed. A certificate of occupancy will not be issued or the final inspection will not be approved until the landscape inspections have been completed.
8. Reflective glazing at the pedestrian level is prohibited. Glazing above the pedestrian level shall be limited to a maximum reflectance rating of 22% (as defined by the National Institute of Standards and Technology).
9. All mechanical equipment, air conditioners and trash areas shall be fully screened in views from the abutting streets.
10. All utility boxes exceeding 27 cubic feet in size shall meet the standards of LVMC Title 19.12.040.
11. Parking lot lighting standards shall be no more than 30 feet in height and shall utilize downward-directed lights with full cut-off luminaires. Lighting on the exterior of buildings shall be shielded and shall be downward-directed. Non-residential property lighting shall be directed away from residential property or screened, and shall not create fugitive lighting on adjacent properties.
12. A fully operational fire protection system, including fire apparatus roads, fire hydrants and water supply, shall be installed and shall be functioning prior to construction of any combustible structures.
13. Prior to the submittal of a building permit application, the applicant shall meet with Planning and Development Department staff to develop a comprehensive address plan for the subject site. A copy of the approved address plan shall be submitted with any future building permit applications related to the site.
14. All City Code requirements and design standards of all City Departments must be satisfied, except as modified herein.

#### Public Works

15. Remove all substandard public street improvements and unused driveway cuts adjacent to this site, if any, and replace with new improvements meeting current City Standards concurrent with development of this site. All new or modifications to existing driveways shall be designed, located and constructed to meet the intent of Standard Drawing #222a.


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16. A Traffic Impact Analysis must be submitted to and approved by the Department of Public Works prior to the issuance of any building or grading permits, submittal of any construction drawings. Comply with the recommendations of the approved Traffic Impact Analysis prior to occupancy of the site. The Traffic Impact Analysis shall also include a section addressing Standard Drawings #234.1 #234.2 and #234.3 to determine additional right-of-way requirements for bus turnouts adjacent to this site, if any; dedicate all areas recommended by the approved Traffic Impact Analysis. All additional rights-of-way required by Standard Drawing #201.1 for exclusive right turn lanes and dual left turn lanes shall be dedicated prior to or concurrent with the commencement of on-site development activities unless specifically noted as not required in the approved Traffic Impact Analysis. Phased compliance will be allowed if recommended by the approved Traffic Impact Analysis. No recommendation of the approved Traffic Impact Analysis, nor compliance therewith, shall be deemed to modify or eliminate any condition of approval imposed by the Planning Commission or the City Council on the development of this site.
  
17. A Drainage Plan and Technical Drainage Study must be submitted to and approved by the Department of Public Works prior to the issuance of any building or grading permits, submittal of any construction drawings or the submittal of a Map subdividing this site, whichever may occur first. Provide and improve all drainageways recommended in the approved drainage plan/study. The developer of this site shall be responsible to construct such neighborhood or local drainage facility improvements as are recommended by the City of Las Vegas Neighborhood Drainage Studies and approved Drainage Plan/Study concurrent with development of this site. In lieu of constructing improvements, in whole or in part, the developer may agree to contribute monies for the construction of neighborhood or local drainage improvements, the amount of such monies shall be determined by the approved Drainage Plan/Study and shall be contributed prior to the issuance of any building or grading permits, or the recordation of a Map subdividing this site, whichever may occur first, if allowed by the City Engineer.
