Minutes:

JIM DiFIORE, Manager of Business Services, indicated that the applicant, who was present, met the criteria for a temporary license. He suggested approval as recommended.

COUNCILMAN BARLOW commented that he recently viewed a show on the massage industry that revealed a lot of things, which might be useful to the City in strengthening the code for the massage industry. He urged staff to obtain a copy, view it and provide a copy to his colleagues.

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COUNCILMAN WOLFSON questioned the process for obtaining a massage license, and asked if he could impose conditions limiting the number of massage therapists. MR. DiFIORE remarked that, according to the application, the applicant intends to devote 75 square feet for massage, and that the massage hours would run concurrent with the hours of operation of the salon.

COUNCILMAN WOLFSON expressed his desire to hold this matter to the first meeting in February, in order to meet with MS. LE and discuss in detail her new business venture.

MS. LE assured COUNCILMAN WOLFSON that she only wants one room dedicated to massage in order to add to the salon services already offered, thereby making it a spa. She pointed out that her business is located within the Suncoast Hotel/Casino and operates from 10-7, Monday-Saturday.

MR. DiFIORE interjected that historically, there are fewer problems with ancillary massage services in a salon.
