Dear Mr. President:

There are many things which are endangering our great nation, most of which we could not list on one page. There are a few which I feel we need to consider more than others. Men in influential offices should more seriously consider the following as being highly dangerous to our national security:

1. Communism
2. Crime
3. Juvenile delinquency
4. Divorce rates
5. Racial conflicts
6. Organizations that attempt to run government
7. mentally ill

8. LIKE OF EDUCATION

These are the things that endanger the security of 185 million Americans. If we don't want to see a repeat of the bombings in Alabama, or another "Kennedy", or tremendous rioting throughout the nation that endangers us all, we must stop fooling around with ourselves and get down to seriousness. Government officials should not make promises which can't be kept they should not promote programs which can not in reality be fulfilled. I often think on these things as I lie awake at night. I fear that some morning we will all wake up to realize another national disaster has occurred, affecting all of us. These are the things which often make us wonder if freedom free?

IS FREEDOM FREE?

Every day man is alive, he is not free from the near existence of God and Man.
 No, you can't buy freedom for long.
 No, you can't buy a piece of mind.
 No, you can't buy the love of others.
 No, you can't buy eternal life for any price - before birth and after death.
 No, you can't buy time, when your time is up.
 No, you can't buy Forever and Always.
 No, you can't buy the right to live outside of Judgement.
 No, you can't buy the soul of another, without selling your own.
 No, you can't buy Joy, Happiness, and Good Health. If so, a millionaire could live forever.
 No, you can't buy the right to ask time to stand still for you alone.
 If so, some of us could not have been born.
 And you ask: "Is freedom free for you and me?"
 Yes, some 8/10ths, some 3/4th, some 1/2 and others never heard of the word "Freedom."
 You are never out of debt of men, for your soul belongs to God. And you have to pay the full price.
 There are many areas of freedom *YOU HAVE YOURS. I HAVE ~~THE~~ MIND.*
~~that are not for sale.~~

President Johnson, this is my second time to write you at the Whitehouse on matters concerning Negroes and Government, and you have denied me the privilege of an answer. It leaves me no other choice than to assume that you are discriminating against the Negro in a polite sort of way. If I do not receive a letter in reply to this one, I can only assume you are using the Negro for political purposes. I am, for one, first to know.

And we will be no more.

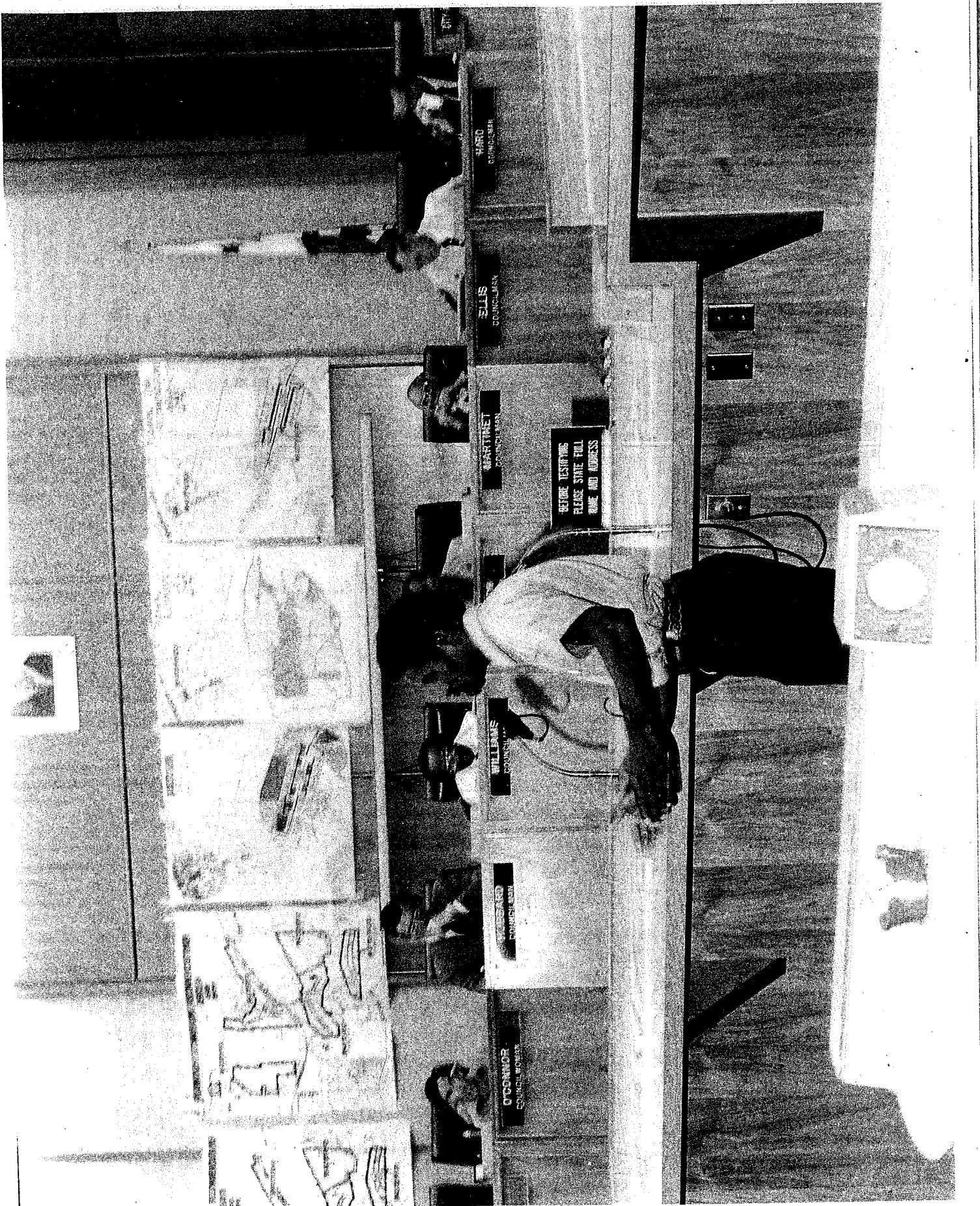
FEAR is his name and FAITH is for us to live by.
