
Mr. O'Neal has indicated that he has made application to obtain a Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department Sheriff's card. Pursuant to his request, we are writing this letter regarding the offender's supervision status in the District of Nevada.

On May 1, 2002, Mr. O'Neal was sentenced to 46 months imprisonment with a three (3) year term of supervised release for committing the offense of Possession of Child Pornography, a violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2252. His supervision commenced on October 28, 2005.

While on supervision, Mr. O'Neal has made good progress. He is currently participating in a sex offender treatment program, has maintained stable residence, and employment with 7-11 as a cashier. Throughout his supervision, he has drug tested on regular basis and has never tested positive for drugs. Currently, his supervision is scheduled to expire on October 27, 2008.
