COUNCILWOMAN TARKANIAN declared the Public Hearing open.

CHIEF DEPUTY CITY ATTORNEY STEED advised that staff made changes to the ordinance regarding animal-drawn vehicles to accommodate the operation at Tule Springs. Subsequent review by staff of Business Services and Animal Control resulted in necessary minor changes. This bill includes some of that cleanup, to not only address some of the provisions that have become outdated, but also to allow more flexibility with similar operations that would take place on trails and paved streets. He recommended approval.

COUNCILWOMAN TARKANIAN clarified that the changes both tighten and expand some of the provisions.
