ADDITIONAL RECOGNITIONS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS:

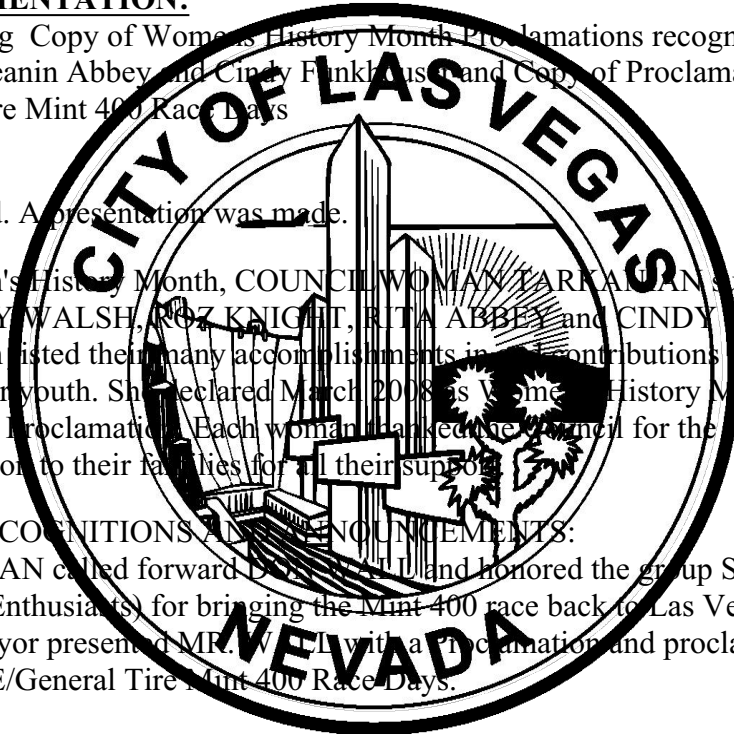

The Mayor presented MR. WALL with a Proclamation and proclaimed March 27-30, 2008, to be SNORE/General Tire Mint 400 Race Days.

MR. WALL, who is the president of SNORE, stated that the race started at Binions Hotel/Casino, formerly the Mint Hotel/Casino. SNORE has been around for 40 years and the race enthusiasts are happy and honored to reintroduce the Mint 400, as well as to be able to participate in all the excitement occurring in the City of Las Vegas.

MAYOR GOODMAN called forward DAN STILL, Deputy City Attorney, and PAUL WERHO, Sergeant with the 426th Civil Affairs Unit, Airborne Special Operations.

MR. STILL said that this is a special presentation to the Council for all its support of the soldiers throughout the years.
