Minutes:

JIM DiFIORE, Manager of Business Services, indicated that there have been some issues, but staff is working with the Elks on resolutions. There were ten calls for service, but four of those were generated by the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department (Metro) in monitoring the establishment. Warnings were issued for what they found. One main concern of the Bolden Area Command is that the establishment is not keeping with the hours of operation of 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m., as well as that the problems from the VFW seem to be migrating to the Elks Lodge. The Elks Lodge operators need to build a rapport with Metro to address these issues.

CITY COUNCIL MEETING OF: MARCH 19, 2008

AL McCRURY, Elks Lodge, said this is his fourth appearance before the Council. He opined that he has complied with all the initial conditions and have imposed some other conditions, such as issuing admission cards to members and guests, strict dress code and surveillance cameras to the interior/exterior. The restricted hours of operation have caused the Elks financial hardship. He requested the hours of operation be extended, as he did not feel the increased or accelerated problems could be attributed to the Elks.

COUNCILMAN BARLOW confirmed with MR. McCRURY that the current hours of operation were 12:00 p.m.-12:00 a.m., Sunday-Thursday and 1:00 p.m.-1:00 a.m., Friday-Saturday. MR. DiFIORE interjected that the Council, if desired, could schedule a review of this permanent license.
