Minutes:

MAYOR GOODMAN complimented a reporter in the audience on the wonderful article in the newspaper and thanked the reporter for contributing. The article solicited more responses from citizens who felt good about what the Council is doing.

ANTHONY HODGES, 123 Sir David, commented that March is supposed to be Women's Month. He believed women should be recognized every day, as they are the sleeping giant of the world. He adamantly opposes abuse towards women and children and desired to see a law passed that would give a lifetime prison sentence to those individuals committing such abuse. It was his opinion that segregation would always exist and everyone has a right to speak their opinion without physical confrontation. MR. HODGES submitted different letters and photos, including a letter from SENATOR BARACK OBAMA and former PRESIDENT RONALD REAGAN.

RASHAN JOSHUA COLLINS appeared on behalf of those protesting the upcoming homosexual parade on May 5th. He read his written comments and referenced a few chapters within the Nevada Revised Statutes. He quoted from the Bible and urged individuals to fear God, repent and stop supporting and serving hypocritical wicked leaders. MR. COLLINS desires to see the abuse and jailing of homeless individuals cease and encourages all to fight for their rights. He pointed out that all 10 of his cases were dismissed and praised God for not needing a public defender. He invited all to come down to Fremont Street where he shares the Word of God.

DOROTHY BARNES reiterated her concerns regarding individuals using her distress signal and the hardship it has created for her.
