Minutes:

The appellant was present.

TONI WEEKS, Detective, Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department (Metro), deferred the Council to the confidential report.

MAYOR GOODMAN questioned the letter from the probation officer, to which DETECTIVE WEEKS replied that one of the conditions of MS. CAMPBELL'S probation is a curfew, and the probation officer did not like the late hours she would be working in this job. The employer, however, supports MS. CAMPBELL'S employment.

**CITY COUNCIL MEETING OF: APRIL 16, 2008**

MS. CAMPBELL said she is in the process of completing the last few hours of school to become a dental assistant. The job she is seeking she hopes to keep even when she has completed her schooling in order to keep busy and to help with her expenses. She would be working Friday, 8:00 p.m. to 12:00 a.m., and Saturday, 8:00 p.m. to 1:00 a.m.

COUNCILMAN ROSS commended MS. CAMPBELL on her schooling efforts and her desire to stay busy; however, he could not support issuing her a work card for a privileged business. AL McCRURY, Elks Lodge, said he would be willing to accommodate her restricted work hours in order to help her comply with her curfew. He is aware of her past, but is still willing to hire her.

COUNCILMAN WOLFSON confirmed with MS. CAMPBELL that she was placed on probation through 2012, has not had any parole violations, is current on community service and fees, is undergoing counseling and could pass a drug test. The Councilman advised his colleagues that MS. CAMPBELL'S biggest worry is to stay out of trouble for the duration of her probation, or she would go to prison.

COUNCILMAN BARLOW supported MS. CAMPBELL'S efforts but expressed concern about approving a work card for the establishment where she was seeking employment because of the individuals that frequent it. He felt he would help her more by denying the work card.

MAYOR GOODMAN and COUNCILMAN BARLOW said they would be happy to issue MS. CAMPBELL a work card for another establishment.
