Minutes:

JOE MAVIGLIA encouraged the Council to participate in a church coalition that was forming to assist inmates returning to society. MR. MAVIGLIA described his efforts to develop manufactured housing as low-income housing, and MAYOR GOODMAN recommended that he contact MARIA CASTILLO-COUCH for further assistance.

RASHAN JOSHUA COLLINS, Christian advocate and local street preacher, described several problems with a recent parade and encouraged the Council to fight sin rather than encourage it. MR. COLLINS gave his contact information and asked for everyone to continue to pray for the City.

CHRIS CHRISTOFF noted that there is a difference between how individuals are treated when coming to City Council meetings versus the County meetings. He described his challenges in trying to meet with Council personnel and stated other citizens have experienced similar problems. He expressed his frustration that the Veterans Memorial Monument Park has not come to fruition, especially with the upcoming holiday. He stated monies had been wasted on special interests and submitted documentation for the record.

ANTHONY HODGES, 123 Sir David Way, displayed a map of the United States and noted how racist attitudes had moved through the country.

ORLANDO DELGADO, 225 South 10th Street, apologized to COUNCILMAN REESE for his comments at a previous meeting. He submitted a video concerning an elderly woman and her deplorable living situation. MAYOR GOODMAN asked that he submit the video to DEPUTY CITY MANAGER ORLANDO SANCHEZ and follow up with COUNCILMAN REESE.

TEDDY RUSSELL, Las Vegas resident, expressed his support for the new ordinance for wedding chapels and the new bus terminal. He described his efforts towards an OSCAR B. GOODMAN library in the downtown area and questioned why he was prohibited from attending Las Vegas weddings as a witness. He concluded by expressing his support for SENATOR REID'S energy program.
