**PURPOSE/BACKGROUND:**

Bill No. 2008-25 proposes to amend LVMC 6.40.140 to eliminate the requirement that a general business-related gaming establishment licensed to sell alcoholic beverages obtain a separate special use permit (SUP) for the gaming use. Such uses (supper clubs and urban lounges) must obtain an SUP for alcoholic beverage service, and typically include up to the maximum 5 slot machines allowed. A single SUP process should be sufficient to consider both the alcohol and gaming-related aspects of the use. City ordinances require a public hearing to allow nonrestricted gaming licensees to be heard regarding any proposal to amend to LVMC 6.40.140.
