Minutes:
ANTHONY HOOVER, 127 St. Francis Court, referred to the Democratic presidential candidates, and expressed his opinion that SENATOR HILLARY CLINTON should be the candidate for Vice President.

MAYOR GOODMAN announced that City staff was available to assist with homeless situations.

BEATRICE TURNER, West Las Vegas, referred to a grocery store coming into her neighborhood and asked when the developer will meet with her community to address the residents' concerns. COUNCILMAN BARLOW replied that a job fair will be held, as well as a meeting with the residents and the developer.

DANIEL PALMQUIST, Las Vegas resident, stated that the economic downturn is due to laws not being enforced. He read a passage from the Bible. Repentance is not just being remorseful but is acknowledging that people are sinners. He used to live a wicked life and the Lord has changed him.

RASHAN JOSHUA COLLINS thanked his supporters for helping him stop the promotion of sin. He reminded the Council that slavery was legalized and was okay with society, but not with God. In Las Vegas there is sin, lewdness and drunkenness. He encouraged the Council to fight for good morals.

DOROTHY BARNES, Las Vegas resident, once again brought forth her issues of having her name on the list.

TOM McGOWAN, Las Vegas resident, was impressed with COUNCILMAN ROSS for his support for the safety and rights of construction workers at City Center. He remained diplomatic with regards to the construction company and owners of the property. He also commended JUDGE JACKIE GLASS-WOLFSON for doing an exemplary job.

WILLIAM HUGGINS stated he has been homeless since the age of 16 and stated he has not found resources. MAYOR GOODMAN referred him to a City staff member who would help him.

ANTHONY SNOWDEN indicated that Nevada Business Services is no longer in operation to provide Las Vegas youth with summer jobs. He asked that the City help create summer jobs, possibly with the Department of Leisure Services. The County has an internship program that will hire an additional hundred students. It is important to provide opportunities for the youth of this community. MAYOR GOODMAN replied that the City of Las Vegas Batteries Included program might help. MR. SNOWDEN pointed out that summer jobs would keep the youth off the streets during the summer.

Councilmembers BARLOW and TARKANTIAN both asked that MR. SNOWDEN be directed to speak to staff regarding summer jobs.
