**PURPOSE/BACKGROUND:**

Representatives from NDOT will present to the Mayor and Council a PowerPoint presentation regarding the I-15 North Design-Build project, Nevada's first design-build project in Southern Nevada. This three-year project starts at the US-95 interchange (the Spaghetti Bowl) and goes north to the Craig Road interchange. Major improvements include widening I-15 to 8 and 10 lanes, reconstruction of interchanges and bridges in this 5.5 mile project area and attractive landscaping throughout.

**Minutes:**

JORGE CERVANTES, Director of Public Works, introduced JEFF HALE and LUCY MELCHER from the Nevada Department of Transportation (NDOT). Using the overhead, MR. HALE gave a PowerPoint presentation on the status of the NDOT I-15 North Design-Build Project. A copy of the PowerPoint presentation is included in the minutes.

MR. HALE stated construction has already begun from Craig Road south to the Cheyenne area. This project is estimated to be completed by March 2010. Speaking on Segment 1 of the project, MR. HALE stated that within the City of Las Vegas, roadway widening will include the areas from the Spaghetti Bowl to Lake Mead. He explained that there will be demolition and reconstruction of bridges and pavements and noted that multiple lane reductions are scheduled covering a period of thirteen months. MR. HALE stated that throughout the Design-Build

Project, NDOT will provide regularly updated information about the construction activities, detours and closures by means of media outreach, message signage, notices and traffic alerts.

COUNCILMAN ROSS inquired as to whether KLVC Channel 2 would be partnering with NDOT as far as Public Service Announcements to ensure that information would be broadcast to the community. DAVID RIGGLEMAN, Director of the Office of Communications, assured COUNCILMAN ROSS that the City has already set up information billboards, located at the Skybridge and as additional information is received from NDOT, the City's Website and Community Billboard are updated.
