At its meeting of July 2, 2008, the City Council is scheduled to consider approval of the School Facilities Element of the Las Vegas 2020 Master Plan, including an Appendix. Contingent upon Council approval of that item, this bill will formalize the approval, adopting the Plan element by means of ordinance.

**Minutes:**

MARGO WHEELER, Director of the Planning and Development Department, explained that this is the first adoption of the Schools Facilities Element for the City of Las Vegas as required by Nevada Revised Statutes. MS. WHEELER stated that the required public hearings were held and the measures include establishing joint planning teams with regard to the open door/open school policies currently in place. In an effort to utilize future land use maps to assist in locating all schools, the amendment of Title 19 would require all special use permits and site development plan reviews for all district schools be consistent with Clark County.

**RECOMMENDING COMMITTEE MEETING OF: JULY 15, 2008**

COUNCILWOMAN TARKANIAN remarked that the proposed legislation was reviewed by a group of school colleagues who felt that the subject matter was well addressed. Commenting on the open door/open schools meetings, COUNCILWOMAN TARKANIAN wondered whether another meeting would be scheduled. She expressed disappointment at not receiving the summary report from the previous open door/open schools meeting which had been held approximately eight months ago.
