Minutes:

MAYOR GOODMAN stated that CITY AUDITOR RADFORD SNELDING told the Council about the progress that he is making as the Internal Auditor. In fact, the City of Las Vegas is the only City in the state where the auditor reports directly to the elected officials and not to the City Managers Office. CITY AUDITOR SNELDING and his staff are doing a great job working closely with the Audit Oversight Committee, which is composed of three private individuals and COUNCILMEN BROWN and WOLFSON as elected officials. The City Auditor reports to the Mayor and provides him with periodic updates a report and the Council believes he is doing a great job. Again, he should receive a bonus and a merit increase, but for the same reasons expressed for CITY MANAGER DOUG SELBY and CITY ATTORNEY BRAD JERBIC,

CITY AUDITOR SNELDING felt it would be inappropriate to take a raise or monetary bonus at this time. To show the Councils appreciation, MAYOR GOODMAN recommended five additional days of vacation. The Mayor thanked him and wished they could do more, which they will when they get a little more financial traction. Due to no fault of the City, there is a bump. He wants to make sure that everyone is working together to provide the services to the constituents, and this is a symbolic way of doing it.
