

JUSTIFICATION LETTER – CENTENNIAL HYUNDAI NEON REQUEST


Thank you for the opportunity to present this justification letter with regard to our application to permit the minimal use of neon on the already approved Centennial Hyundai facility located on Centennial Center Drive in the Town Center area of Las Vegas, Nevada. The following shall be a brief description and explanation of why we feel this request is justified at this time.

This request is to allow the installation of a minimal amount of neon on the Centennial Hyundai auto dealership in the “Town Center” area of Centennial Hills. The request is made in order to provide the new Centennial Hyundai dealership with equal opportunity to visually market its product along with the other existing auto dealerships in the Town Center area. Prior to making this request, we reviewed the use of neon on the existing businesses in the Town Center area, including, but not limited to, auto dealerships, restaurants and retail stores. We have found, and hope you will agree, that our request is consistent with the use of neon on these businesses currently in operation. This request is not made lightly and in full understanding of the current codes and regulations regarding the use of neon in this area.
