Minutes:

JIM DiFIORE, Manager of Business Services, stated he was aware that the request would be for an extension of the temporary license if the permanent license is not granted. He noted that the applicant, REGINA EDWARDS, was present with her attorney, JEFF BENDAVID.

MR. DiFIORE stated that an audit verifying compliance with supper club regulations regarding alcohol and food sales percentages up to August found alcohol sales slightly above the 45 percent limitation. In addition, staff has concerns regarding the applicant's past financial problems dealing with insufficient funds and debt collection. On one occasion during an inspection, staff found the applicant operating without an employee list which is required by Code; a citation was given for which there is an upcoming court date.

Based upon Metro's report, the citation and the ongoing audit, MR. DiFIORE could support extending the temporary license with certain conditions.

ATTORNEY JEFF BENDAVID appeared with the applicant REGINA EDWARDS, and confirmed that the six-month extension would be in the best interest of MS. EDWARDS and the City. The extension will allow for trial and error and give MS. EDWARDS the opportunity to become an even better manager of the business in order to ultimately be granted a permanent license.

MR. DiFIORE recommended an additional six-month extension of the temporary license with a review and compliance with all supper club regulations. During this time, should there be any changes to the operation of the business, MS. EDWARDS must notify staff in advance of the changes, including the type of operation and management. MAYOR GOODMAN confirmed ATTORNEY JEFF BENDAVID and MS. EDWARDS concurrence with the conditions.
