PURPOSE/BACKGROUND:

In order to receive federal and state funds for housing, homeless, and community development activities each year, the City of Las Vegas must submit an Action Plan to HUD. The Draft Action Plan outlines all activities that will be undertaken by the city of Las Vegas for the period of July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2010. Funding sources include ADDI, CDBG, ESG, HOME and HOPWA funds from HUD; and HOME funds from the State of Nevada.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that Council approve the submittal of the City of Las Vegas 2009-2010 Action Plan to HUD, including consideration of public comment as required by HUD.

Minutes:

MAYOR GOODMAN declared the Public Hearing open.

STEPHEN HARSIN, Director of Neighborhood Services, requested approval of the City's 2009-2010 Action Plan to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) as required by the federal government. The action plan captures the City's activities funded by

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HUD for the upcoming fiscal year.

Using a PowerPoint Presentation which was later submitted for the record, MR. HARSIN went over the action plan. All activities and programs were previously approved at the 3/18/2009 City Council meeting and approval of the plan will secure federal funding. He pointed out that the HUD funds are separate from the federal stimulus funds.

TIM WHITRIGHT, Neighborhood Development Manager, explained that a citizen participation portion of the plan was required by HUD. Several neighborhood meetings were held by the City and the Community Development Recommending Board and comments from citizens were also gathered through surveys. Additionally, notices of the plan were advertised in local newspapers and copies of the plan were made available at community centers. Approval of the plan by HUD was expected by June 2009.

MAYOR GOODMAN declared the Public Hearing closed.
