Minutes:

MAYOR GOODMAN declared the Public Hearing open.

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HAM GABAY explained that the temporary liquor license is for the business located at 24 Fremont Street.

COUNCILMAN BARLOW read a letter from JOHN THOMPSON, the general manager of the adjacent establishment, objecting to the approval of the liquor license. COUNCILMAN BARLOW thanked him for voicing his concerns, but emphasized that he did not believe approving this application would have any adverse affect on the surrounding businesses. He added that he strongly endorses all activities that attract more visitors to the downtown area.

COUNCILMAN BARLOW asked COUNCILMAN BARLOW to consider imposing a six-month review. COUNCILMAN BARLOW concurred and explained the procedure to the applicant.

MARGO CHELIEF, Director of Planning and Development, provided the verbiage for the added condition.

Regarding Item 67, CAROL MEYER, Finance and Business Services, stated that in addition to having met all the requirements for consideration of the temporary license, MR. GABAY will need to comply with the added condition requiring the addition of a convenience store. MS. MEYER explained that the applicant was approved of the 3 percent items that are required in his store in order to meet the definition. MR. GABAY concurred with the added condition and acknowledged that he understood the requirements.

MAYOR GOODMAN declared the Public Hearing closed.
