Minutes:

JIM DiFIORE, Manager of Business Services, noted the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department (Metro) investigative report had been provided to the Council and highlighted the areas of concern. DOMINIC LAINO had violated the condition which allowed entertainment until 2 a.m. on Sunday nights only by having entertainment on other nights. MR. LAINO was also issued a Chronic Nuisance Notice by the Metro Downtown Area Command. MR. DiFIORE stated that MR. LAINO has not complied with the Council's direction on the operation of this business and he recommended that staff be directed to draft a Complaint for Disciplinary Action against MR. LAINO.

MR. DiFIORE informed COUNCILMAN BARLOW that if the Council approves the Complaint for disciplinary action, the Council may consider revocation of the license, suspension of the

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license, imposition of fines or other actions deemed appropriate.

MR. LAINO appeared with ATTORNEY DEAN KAJIOKA, 810 South Casino Center Boulevard, and ATTORNEY KAJIOKA confirmed that MR. LAINO had reviewed the Metro report. ATTORNEY KAJIOKA noted that MR. LAINO was appealing the Chronic Nuisance Notice and a hearing was scheduled.

COUNCILMAN REESE stated that the information contained in the report supported MR. DiFIORES recommendation that a complaint be filed against MR. LAINO. A privileged license is only given out after careful consideration and licensees are expected to abide by the City's rules and regulations. CITY ATTORNEY BRAD JERBIC assisted COUNCILMAN REESE in crafting the motion.

MAYOR GOODMAN suggested that ATTORNEY KAJIOKA save his presentation for the upcoming hearing and ATTORNEY KAJIOKA agreed.
