I am formally requesting all reports, complaints, and the final reports for the investigation against LARRY KUSLER.

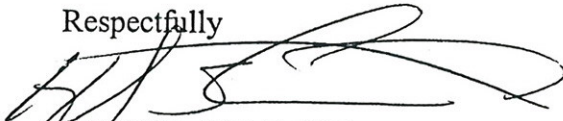
I am requesting your response within ten (10) business days.

Dear Gammon,

I write to file a complaint against Larry Kusler and request an investigation into what I believe is his abuse of power and possibly vengeful conduct towards me. As you may know, I have had prior problems with Mr. Kusler dating back to 2004 and 2005. During that period, Mr. Kusler issued a "stop order" on my Bonanza property. After requesting the reasons in writing for the "stop order," the only response to my request was the delivery by Mr. Kusler of a slip paper indicating that the "stop order" had been lifted. It is incredible that Mr. Kusler was able to issue and withdraw the "stop order" without an official explanation. Given my good relationship with the City of Las Vegas, I did not pursue that matter any further and thought it was water under the bridge.

On April 21, 2007, I hand delivered a letter to your office requesting a meeting with you to discuss the recent issues with my application for "El Rey." The letter also referred to misconduct by a Las Vegas Fire and Rescue Department inspector and the inspector was Mr. Kusler. Following my delivery of that April 21 letter, Mr. Kusler visited my property again, allegedly acting in his official capacity, and was accompanied by other City of Las Vegas personnel, including Mr. Tom Gugino from the Department of Building and Safety. I personally found it offensive that the Fire and Rescue Department would send the same inspector to my property against whom I had just complained about. Moreover, it appears inappropriate that Mr. Gugino would investigate and question other aspects of my Bonanza property beyond Suite 130 which is at issue with my application for "El Rey."

Please be advised that Mr. Kusler is no longer authorized on my property pending the completion of your investigation and an official response in writing to my request. In addition, I request that you speak with City Manager Elizabeth N. Fretwell to inquire as

to the reasons why Mr. Gugino was questioning other aspect of my Bonanza property beyond the issues relating to "El Rey."

As a longtime resident of Las Vegas and a member of the business community, it is my intention to resolve all disputes relating to my application for "El Rey" at the administrative level, where it belongs. I look forward to hearing back from you.

Dear Gammon,

I write to request a written explanation as to why the Las Vegas Fire and Rescue Department denied my application for "El Rey," Suite 130 of 4561 E. Bonanza Rd., Las Vegas, Nevada. In addition, I request an in-person meeting with you at your earliest convenience to discuss the denial of the business license for "El Rey" and what I perceive at best as unprofessional, discourteous conduct by your department's inspectors.

By way of background, I applied for a business license for "El Rey" in early March 2009. On March 12, 2009, a building inspector visited the proposed cite for "El Rey" and issued an immediate "stop order" for auto repair. The Las Vegas Fire and Rescue Department official who issued the "stop order" was abrasive and hostile. A few days later a posse of Las Vegas Fire and Rescue Department inspectors appeared at my property. It is unclear why so many inspectors were necessary to analyze a proposed site for a business license.

Until we have an opportunity to discuss in-person the above-referenced issues, I do not authorize any visits on my properties located at 4561 E. Bonanza Rd., Las Vegas, Nevada and 1501 N. Eastern Ave. Las Vegas, Nevada from any Las Vegas Fire and Rescue Department inspectors unless they have a court order. Of course, this prohibition should not be interpreted to prevent emergency fire and rescue services.

I look forward to hearing back from you and resolving what I hope is a simple misunderstanding.

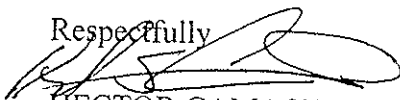
I am requesting your response in writing within ten (10) business days.

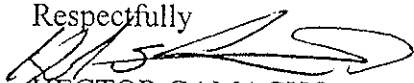
