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Minutes:

CAROL MEYER, Business Services Supervisor, indicated that the last inspection found the applicant to be in compliance with all conditions placed upon this license. This is an ancillary license to an existing chiropractic establishment. She recommended approval of a permanent license with the conditions that all massage therapists have a valid state and City license, that the massage area cannot occupy more than 150 square feet, that they have no exterior signage that offer massage, that advertising massage and the hours of operation must match the those the business.

DR. KLINE was present and agreed to all conditions.

COUNCILMAN ROSS stated there are a number of legitimate chiropractors that offer this type of business, and he asked if there have been challenges with non-legitimate chiropractor offices. MS. MEYER replied there has been confusion because in the past they were exempt from having a license for massage. Today, if a chiropractor wants to offer a massage, a separate license is not required.
