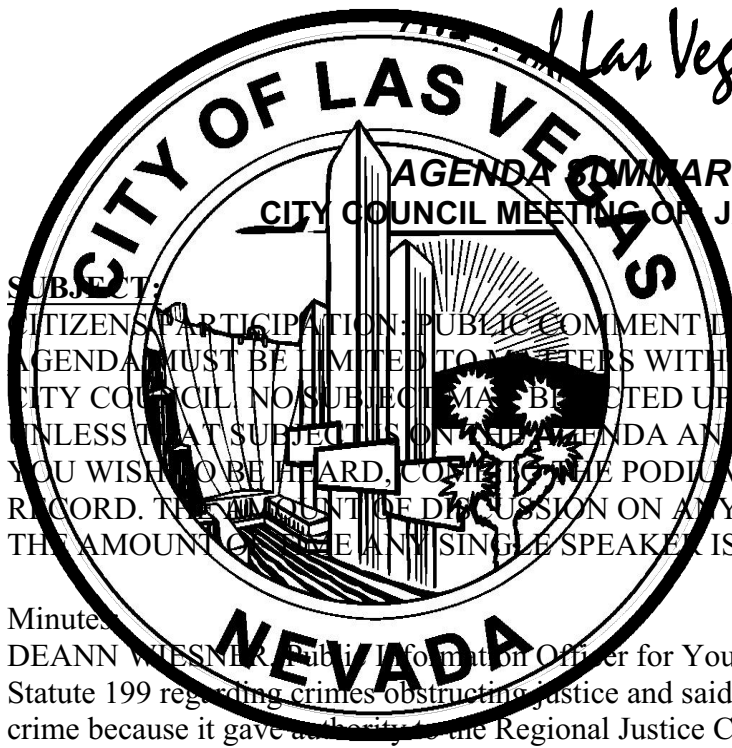

Minutes

DEANN WIESNER, Public Information Officer for Your Right, displayed Nevada Revised Statute 199 regarding crimes obstructing justice and said that this Council is guilty of such a crime because it gave authority to the Regional Justice Center to use the Odyssey Case Management system, which is totally flawed. She alleged that LYNN MOORE of Tyler Technologies indicated to her that the problem stems from LAURA FUCCI'S decision to go to a case management system that only takes evidence going forward from May 2005, when the contract on the system started.

MS. WIESNER indicated that COUNCILMAN WOLFSON was notified of his failure to conduct due diligence after being notified at his law office in the presence of his office staff that the Odyssey court documents were corrupted. A letter was also forwarded to CITY MANAGER ELIZABETH FRETWELL about the problem.

DOROTHY BARNES, Las Vegas resident, asked if the Council has taken any action to address her ongoing petition to remove her name from programs used at Nellis Air Force Base.

JOHN RACE mentioned the case Race vs. Theuson and stated that he became homeless after he revealed to JUDGE KATHY HARDCASTLE during his divorce proceedings that he would be running for lieutenant governor and the reasons he would be running. The judge became so outraged that she took action that forced him into homelessness.

ALIREZA RAFTARI raised concern about property taxes increasing while the value of his home is decreasing. MAYOR PRO TEM REESE referred him to CITY MANAGER ELIZABETH FRETWELL for assistance. COUNCILWOMAN TARKANIAN announced that there was an article in the newspaper asking to contact the Assessor's office about possible errors.
