ADDENDUM REVENUE SHARE AGREEMENT

Replace Section 2 from Revenue Share Agreement (as put forward for the 1/20/2010 City Council Meeting)

2. Revenue Share: For and in consideration of the City's support set forth herein, Dot Vegas Inc. agrees and shall pay to the City the greater of (a) **\$0.75** per registration year for each second level domain name (the "Domain Name(s)") registered in the .vegas TLD for which the Company collects domain name registration or renewal revenue; or (b) ten percent (10%) of the gross **revenues** derived by the Company from domain name registrations, or renewals thereof (the "Revenue Share"). The Revenue Share shall commence with the registration of the first Domain Name registered in the .vegas TLD and shall continue for the duration of Company's appointment by ICANN as the .vegas TLD registry manager, including any renewals of the original agreement between the Company and ICANN. The Revenue Share payment shall be disbursed to the City on or before the 15th day of the month for those Domain Names registered or renewed in the previous calendar month. The Revenue Share payment to the City shall be accompanied by a written statement (the "Revenue Share Statement") setting forth the calculations of the Revenue Share paid, including the total number of Domain Names registered or renewed in the previous month for which the Company recognized registration or renewal revenue. If the City disputes any amounts shown in the Revenue Share Statement, the City shall notify the Company in writing of such dispute within thirty (30) days from the date of the Revenue Share Statement. The dispute statement shall include a general description of the dispute and documentation supporting the City's position.

The Company will retain at its principal place of business, for a period of three (3) years after the due date of each Revenue Share Statement all of the files, records and books of accounts prepared in the normal course of business which contain data reasonably required for the computation and verification of the amounts paid by the Company in connection with each such Revenue Share Statement. The Company will permit the City and its representatives, on reasonable notice, to audit at any reasonable times (but not more often than twice each fiscal year) all such files, records and books of accounts and to take extracts therefrom and make copies thereof for the purpose of verifying the correctness of the Revenue Share Statements provided by the Company hereunder. The City shall pay the cost of such audits. If any such audit reveals that the Company has underpaid the City, the Company will promptly pay the City the amount of the underpayment.

Dear Mayor Goodman:

We are intellectual property counsel for Vegas.com, LLC ("Vegas.com"). I am writing regarding Agenda Item #45 described as the discussion and possible action regarding a resolution authorizing the support of Dot Vegas, Inc.'s application to the Internet Corporation for Assigned Names and Numbers and the Revenue Share Agreement between the City of Las Vegas and Dot Vegas, Inc. for the creation of the .vegas generic Top Level Domain ("vegas gTLD"). This agenda item raises significant complex legal and business issues that we believe the Council should carefully consider before making any decision regarding whether or not to provide exclusive support to Dot Vegas, Inc. or any other entity for the creation of a .vegas gTLD.

Vegas.com, which is based in Henderson, Nevada, employs hundreds of Las Vegasans and generates substantial revenue for Las Vegas businesses by, among other things, selling hotel rooms, travel packages, tours, wedding services, show tickets, and dinner reservations primarily through its web site at <vegas.com>. Vegas.com makes a substantial contribution to the promotion of Las Vegas and the revenue generated by businesses located in the City of Las Vegas as well as the associated tax revenue.

Vegas.com owns substantial trademark rights in the vegas.com mark. Vegas.com owns seventeen (17) United States trademark registrations for the vegas.com mark for numerous goods and services, including advertising, travel agency services, on-line databases for entertainment purposes, arranging for tickets, reservations, arranging excursions, and providing information related to gaming, arts, nightlife, and leisure. Vegas.com has spent substantial time, effort and money in developing the vegas.com brand since it began using the mark in 1995. Vegas.com has established substantial goodwill in the vegas.com brand. As the owner of the vegas.com trademark, Vegas.com owns the exclusive right to use the vegas.com mark for numerous goods and services. As the owner of the vegas.com trademark, Vegas.com is required to enforce its rights against third parties that may tradeoff of the goodwill or reputation of the vegas.com mark or cause confusion among consumers.

Vegas.com is concerned that the introduction of a .vegas gTLD is likely to cause confusion, deception or mistake among consumers as to the source or origin of the services offered under the .vegas gTLD, as to an affiliation or relationship between Vegas.com and Dot Vegas, Inc., and as to Vegas.com's approval or sponsorship of Dot Vegas, Inc.'s services. Indeed, .vegas is nearly identical to vegas.com. Goods and services offered through .vegas web sites will likely offer goods and services that will overlap those offered by Vegas.com. Accordingly, commercial use of the .vegas mark may constitute trademark infringement under the Lanham Act, 15 U.S.C. §§ 1114 and 1125(a), as well as violations of state and common law.

Moreover, Vegas.com is concerned that the adoption and use of the .vegas mark as a gTLD is likely to dilute the distinctiveness of the vegas.com mark or tarnish the goodwill and reputation symbolized by the vegas.com mark. Through its extensive and widespread use, the vegas.com mark has acquired fame. As a result, it is entitled to special protection under the Federal Trademark Dilution Act (as amended by the Trademark Dilution Revision Act), 15 U.S.C. § 1125(c), as well as the Nevada antidilution statute. Even if consumers are not confused by the .vegas mark, use of the .vegas mark is likely to dilute the distinctiveness of the vegas.com mark and/or tarnish the goodwill and reputation of Vegas.com over time.

If the City of Las Vegas provides exclusive support to Dot Vegas, Inc. for use of the .vegas mark and stands to generate revenue from the .vegas mark, the City may expose itself to liability for contributory and/or vicarious trademark infringement. Indeed, the liability for contributory trademark infringement is expansive and can extend to any person or entity that induces, facilitates or contributes to the infringement and profits from the infringement. Similarly, the liability for vicarious trademark infringement can extend to any person or entity that controls or has the ability to control the infringement.

Before making any decision regarding whether or not to provide exclusive support to Dot Vegas, Inc. or any third party for .vegas gTLD, Vegas.com urges the Council to carefully consider all of the potential legal issues (including, but not limited to, the intellectual property issues), and the impact of the Council's decision on Vegas.com and other local businesses that may be negatively affected by the .vegas gTLD. Vegas.com respectfully urges the Council to postpone action on this agenda item at tomorrow's meeting and open the process for further consideration and participation by affected third parties.
