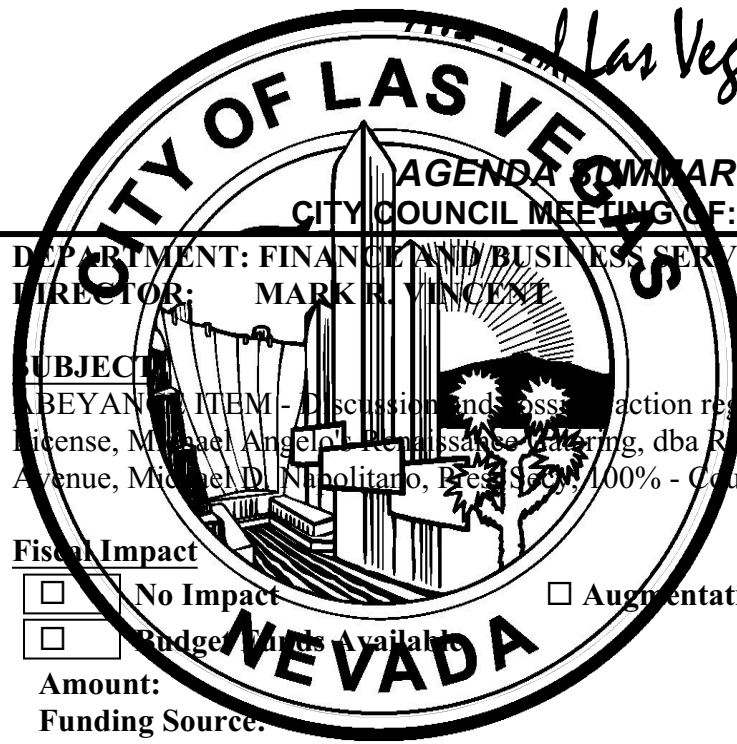

Motion made by GARY REESE to Approve subject to the following conditions as read for the record:

- A. The applicant is prohibited from being present at any event with individuals under 18 years of age.
- B. The Business Services Manager or Supervisor may approve or deny the permit based upon the disclosures made by the licensee.
- C. Any misrepresentations of information on the permit application verified in advance of the event, or upon the inspection of the event, will result in suspension of the alcoholic beverage license.
- D. If suspended, the licensee will be entitled to a hearing on the suspension by the City Council at the next available City Council meeting.
- E. There shall be a six-month review at a hearing at City Council.

Minutes:

JIM DiFIORE, Business Services Manager, introduced ATTORNEY KAREN ROSS, who was present with the applicant, MICHAEL NAPOLITANO. He mentioned that staff met with MR. NAPOLITANO and from that meeting certain conditions were suggested by ATTORNEY ROSS, which he read into the record. In addition, he stressed that this license requires the applicant to apply for a license for each event, which is separate from the subject license. MR. NAPOLITANO informed staff that he is the chef for the subject business and on occasion, he may appear at some of the events.

MAYOR GOODMAN confirmed MR. NAPOLITANO'S acceptance of the conditions read by MR. DiFIORE and his understanding that making this application for alcohol would require a background check.

Given MR. NAPOLITANO'S efforts in being very careful of his application and in a previous meeting, MR. DiFIORE told COUNCILMAN WOLFSON that staff believes he has been forthright in the review process. His last conviction was 10 years ago. The Councilman believes in individuals paying their debt, but he is also open to giving second chances. He congratulated MR. NAPOLITANO for his successful rehabilitation to date.

ATTORNEY ROSS thanked the City for their efforts during this review process and for the Council's consideration for approval.

MR. DiFIORE elaborated on one of staff's conditions requiring the applicant to disclose to the City's Business Services Division the age of attendees at events. However, COUNCILMAN ANTHONY did not agree and was adamant in amending the condition to prohibit MR. NAPOLITANO from being present at any event with individuals under 18 years of age. ATTORNEY ROSS stated her client's acceptance of COUNCILMAN ANTHONY'S amended condition and added that should there be an event with minors, MR. NAPOLITANO would ensure that one of his key employees would be on site and that MR. NAPOLITANO would only deliver the food prior to the event commencing.
